25 years of oil in shetland black gold tide is an important moving and insightful photographic journey into the relationship between the shetland islands and oil it captures how things were before the coming of the hydrocarbon riches what happened and how things changed and it does so largely through the faces of those who lived and still live on the old rock if pictures tell the real story a subtle light is shed on events by detailed emotional sometimes very funny verbatim interviews with boatmen and teachers oil executives and labourers barmen and fish processors waitresses and painters ordinary people with extraordinary tales to tell the pictures come from the archives and a special summer assignment in 2003 by acclaimed photographer tom kidd the interviews were carried out by bbc broadcaster and well known writer tom morton north sea oil flowed into shetland a quarter of a century ago and for the inhabitants of this remote island community nothing would ever be the same among the thousands of men and women who followed the oil to the islands was a young photographer called tom kidd kidd went on to a distinguished career in photography with many award winning assignments for national and international publications he has exhibited widely and has photographs in the collection of the scottish arts council and the victoria and albert museum a long standing interest in flying led him to his current involvement in piloting helicopters longstanding admirer of kidd s work suggested they collaborate on a book which would revisit the beginnings of oil in shetland marking 25 years since the first oil ashore morton who lives in shetland and first visited in 1978 was keen to see kidd s long lost shetland photographs republished along with others representing key moments in the islands s relationship with oil and a series of new pictures bringing the story right up to date kidd s archive turned out to include many forgotten photographs some of which are now being seen publicly for the first time morton carried out a series of interviews with men and women who had experienced the oil boom and all that has happened since and kidd shot portraits of them morton s interviews were broadcast on bbc radio scotland in late 2003 under the title welcome to hornswoggle county photographs both new and old in a stunning meditation on what oil means and has meant for the shetland community it is an important work of social history an act of homage to the individuals who helped bring oil to shetland and yet preserved a way of life still unique in europe

this 4th edition of the geology of scotland is greatly expanded from the previous edition with 34 authors contributing to 20 chapters a new format has been adopted to provide a different perspective on the geology of scotland a brief introduction is followed by a chapter outlining some of the important historical aspects that in the 19th century placed scottish geologists in the forefront of a new science scotland is constructed from a number of terranes that finally combined in roughly their present positions prior to about 410 million years ago thus the geology of each terrane is described up the time of amalgamation providing chapters on the southern uplands midland valley highlands grampian and hebridean terranes at the end of this section a brief synthesis summarizes the events that resulted in the amalgamation of the various terranes into the present configuration traditional practice is followed in the description of the old red sandstone carboniferous permian triassic jurassic cretaceous tertiary and quaternary strata a separate chapter covers tertiary igneous rocks an attempt is made to tell the story of the geological evolution of scotland rather than catalogue all areas and formations priority is given to the onshore geology encouraging the reader to go into the field and visit some of the world class geology on show in scotland the chapters are broadly based attempting to integrate the sedimentary and igneous histories and summarize changes in palaeogeography and palaeoenvironments economic aspects are covered with chapters on metalliferous minerals bulk resources coal and hydrocarbons a new departure is the chapter on aspects of environmental geology and sustainability additionally this publication contains a colour section of 32 plates illustrating aspects of scottish geology as well as a coloured geological map of scotland

oil spill environmental forensics case studies includes 34 chapters that serve to present various aspects of environmental forensics in relation to real world oil spill case studies from around the globe authors representing academic government and private researcher groups from 14 countries bring a diverse and global perspective to this volume oil spill environmental forensics case studies addresses releases of natural gas methane automotive gasoline and other petroleum fuels lubricants vegetable oils paraffin waxes bitumen manufactured gas plant residues urban runoff and of course crude oil the latter ranging from light bakken shale oil to heavy canadian oil sands oil new challenges surrounding forensic investigations of stray gas in the shallow subsurface volatiles in air dissolved chemicals in water including passive

samplers and biological tissues associated with oil spills are included as are the effects and long term oil weathering long term monitoring in urbanized and non urbanized environments fate and transport forensic historical research new analytical and chemical data processing and interpretation methods presents cases in each chapter on the application of specific oil spill environmental forensic techniques features chapters written by international experts from both academia and industry includes relevant concepts and theories elucidated for each theme

the social impact of oil 1982 examines how the town of peterhead in the uk hitherto a remote fishing port was changed by north sea oil it looks at the wheeling and dealing that went on between property speculators multinational companies local government and municipal bodies as well as discussing the clash of city money and small town as well as the practical problems of the labour market housing and planning it analyses the way the town changed the advantages oil brought often unintentionally as well as the many challenges

this book intends to inform the key participants in extractive projects namely the communities the host governments and the investors about good practice for effective community engagement based on analysis of international standards and expectations lessons from selected case studies and innovations in public participation the extent of extractive industries varies widely around the arctic as do governmental and social attitudes towards resource development whilst most arctic communities are united in seeking investment to fund education healthcare housing transport and other essential services as well as wanting to benefit from improved employment and business opportunities they have different views as to the role that extractive industries should play in this within each community there are multiple perspectives and the goal of public participation is to draw out these perspectives and seek consensus part i of the book analyses the international standards that have emerged in recent years regarding public participation in particular in respect of indigenous peoples part ii presents six case studies that aim to identify both good and bad practices and to reflect upon the distinct conditions needs expectations strategies and results for each community examined part iii explores the importance of meaningful participation from a corporate perspective and identifies some common themes that require consideration if arctic voices are to shape

extractive industries in arctic communities in drawing together international law and standards case studies and examples of good practice this anthology is a timely and invaluable resource for academics legal advisors and those working in resource development and public policy

compares local regional institutional structures established in the shetland islands and alaska to control the effects of offshore petroleum development in order to identify models for the canadian beaufort region

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
